Chippewas Make History

Last Friday the Manistee Chippewa football team made school history in multiple ways. The 2018 team is the first Manistee team to ever beat Muskegon Catholic Central, and this win left the Chips with a 7-0 winning streak, the first time a Manistee football team has gone 7-0 since 1961. The first quarter started off with a 24 yard pass to **Logan Buren (12)** from **Trevor Johns (12)**. Muskegon Catholic ended up getting ahead of the Chips by the end of the first quarter and into the second. A 6 yard run by Trevor Johns in the second quarter got the Chips their second touchdown of the game, and a 40 yard pass to **Fletcher Carpenter (11)** at the end of the second quarter was an exciting way to tie the game up at half time. With a 2 yard run from Trevor in the third quarter, the Chippewas took the lead and held it for the rest of the game. The fourth quarter held another run by Trevor Johns which set the final score of the game to 35-21. Logan Buren (12) led the Chips with 6 tackles, followed by **Keagan Bonzheim (11)** with 5.

If you want to see the MHS football team continuing making history, come to Chippewa Field and watch this Friday's game against Calvin Christian at 7:00pm.

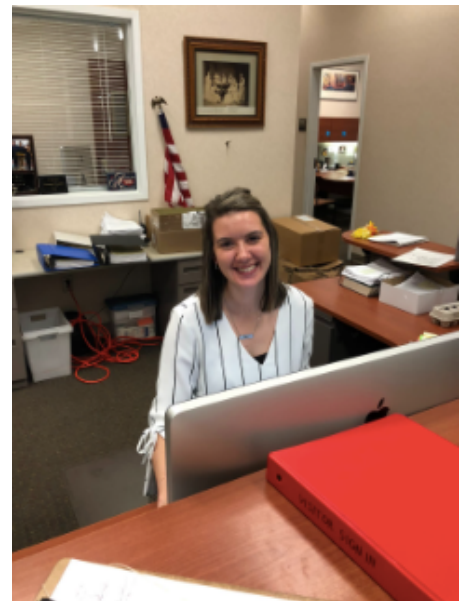

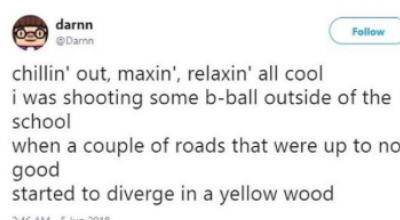

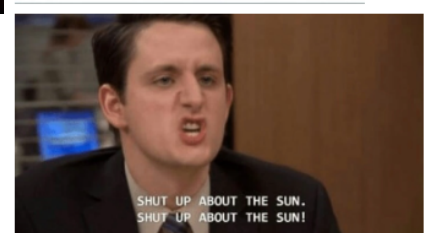
