- Potential for Stabilizing Property Values\*
- **Keeps Young Families in Our Community**
- **Attracts Economic Development**
- Provides Work Force for Area Businesses
- Develops Students into Productive Citizens

#### **Community Impact of Your School District**

\*According to the National Bureau of Economic Research, there is a clear connection between school expenditures and home values. A report titled, "Using Market Valuation to Assess Public School Spending," found that for every dollar spent on public schools in a community, home values increased by \$20. These findings indicate that additional school expenditures may benefit everyone in the community, whether or not those residents actually have children in the local public-school system.

#### **Insulating Property Values**

\*In a 2009 study at Georgia Tech, the effects of the recession on housing values were studied to identify changes in the demand for certain characteristics of residential properties as the market was falling.

They analyzed home buying influencing characteristics such as bedrooms, bathrooms, square footage, age, stories, garage, basement, general interior and exterior, school district, crime stats, median income, etc. The research discovered that a quality school district can have a profound insulating effect on the housing values in the surrounding community.

- Considered Community: Collaborations with community partners that allow us to deliver diverse resources for supporting MAPS students and families.






Through the feedback received it became clear that our focus should be concentrated on elementary need.


The facilities plan delivers a strategy for bringing our elementary classrooms to modern standards in addition to key priority items identified at the MMHS site.

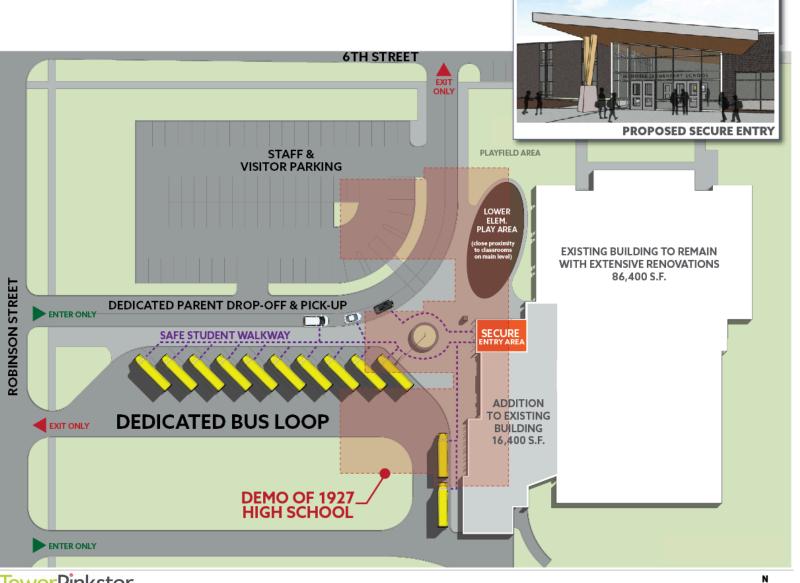

# A FUTURE FOR MMHS SCOPE OF WORK


Feedback identified the need for additional gym space as a high priority to accommodate athletic and other extracurricular activities for both the district and the community.

# WHY A MIDDLE SCHOOL GYM?

- 3 grade levels have been added to the building since 2013
- Practice Schedule Improvement –
   Students will no longer have to practice
   until late into the evening hours due to
   facilities overscheduling
- Dedicated Middle School facility and locker rooms
- Space for multiple PE classes to be held at once
- Room for additional extracurricular activities
- Space available for scheduling of community events



# A FUTURE FOR MADISON SCOPE OF WORK


The Madison Community Learning Center has been reimagined as resource hub offering practical resources and innovative programs to meet the educational, health, social, and behavioral needs of students throughout our community.

Current Partners:

- Face to Face Homeschool
- Manistee ISD
- CentraWellness

With the relocation of Pre-school programming to the Kennedy Elementary Building, the **MAPS administrative offices** would be relocated to the Madison building. With minor alterations and needed mechanical updates, Madison will be at full capacity servicing many facets of student support.

- Minor building renovation to create administrative offices
- ADA renovation of toilet rooms
- Replace boiler and relocate A/C from Central Office
- Roof Replacement

### **SCOPE OF WORK**

Located in a park-like, neighborhood setting, the property of Jefferson Elementary lends itself to the site for a shared community green space and necessary athletic/practice fields.









Removing the **Jefferson Building** (the oldest of the 4 buildings currently online – built 1954) the district will save millions in anticipated maintenance for a building not needed to serve current enrollment forecasts.




