Training opportunities were identified, discussed in detail by the committee, and from that conversation the 'SSAC Community Safety Series' was born. The administration presented the following opportunities to the committee:

- OK 2 Say Program will be held Wednesday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, MMHS Auditorium, 6:00 to 7:00 pm -SSAC presents a community learning opportunity for families of MAPS K-12 students brought to Manistee by the State Attorney General's Office. Join us for an informative presentation about Michigan's statewide OK 2 Say program offering students 24/7 confidential access to report bullying and other acts of violence. - Stewards of Children April is Child Abuse Prevention Month Tracy Smith of the Child Advocacy Center will present at the SSAC meeting on Monday, April 8<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 to 7:30 at Kennedy Elementary in the Library. A flyer will be distributed and added to the website. Staff received training prior to holiday season. Content of training: Identifying vulnerable youth, risk factors for neglect and abuse, how to have hard conversations and how to report.
- QPR To be presented to full staff at April Professional Development. SSAC members are invited to attend. Community training date TBD – To be organized by Jason Traviss
- Opioid Symposium Will be attended by 12 to 14 MAPS students in April. Every student organization will be represented.
- Student Vaping Assembly Very well received. Has started conversations between students and teachers.
