What is human trafficking?

Human trafficking is when someone is commercially exploited for work or sex by using force, fraud, or coercion; OR if someone under 18 years old is participating in commercial sex. Anyone can be a victim: boy, girl, adult, child, all races, religions, etc.

What does it look like when someone tries to traffick someone for sex?

- Tries to get you away from your family/friends
- Asks you to keep your relationship a secret
- Asks for nude or suggestive photos

- Promises a better life or job if you follow them
- Bribes you with expensive gifts
- Pushes you past what you're comfortable doing romantically
