The Armory Youth Project (commonly referred to as AYP or the Armory) is a not-for-profit organization that provides a safe environment where young people from grades 6-12 can build community and be encouraged in their educational, emotional, physical and Christian spiritual development. The Armory is located at 555 First Street in Manistee, MI.

"This kickoff event is a great opportunity for our students and their families to see what all we have to offer whether it's sports activities or arts and crafts, yoga or tutoring," said Wojciechowski. "Since we have opened the kids have had fun in a variety of activities including cooking classes where they have made homemade salsa and pita chips and veggie pizzas. They have also made beaded jewelry from polymer clay, built mason bee houses and enjoyed sports such as ping pong and cornhole.

Registrations will be done during the event and students who register will receive a gift bag including a free water bottle from the Armory and a string backpack provided by Shelby Bank.

Registration required to enhance security

The Armory will also have a new security/access system that allows each student to swipe their card to access the Armory. This ensures the Armory knows who is in the facility at all times. The Armory is also following State of Michigan, CDC guidelines and Department of Health guidelines to help ensure a safe and secure environment.
