IN-PERSON LEARNING [MI Safe Schools Phases 4-6]

Learning Structure

Masks: All students age 3 and older will be required to wear masks in all indoor spaces and outdoors only when social distancing requirements cannot be met. Those students riding the bus will be required to wear masks during transport. Masks must be worn from the point of arrival at school.



Arrival & Departure: Students will arrive on campus and will be directed to their first period classrooms. Masks must be worn upon arrival. Students will have opportunities at lunch and for outdoor learning that will provide breaks during the day to remove their masks and get some fresh air.



Restroom Use: Grades 6-8 and grades 9-12 will have separately scheduled bathroom opportunities with cleaning done in between.



Hygiene: Hygiene stations will be available throughout the buildings and in all classrooms with supplies restocked daily. Students and staff will be encouraged to follow standard hygiene protocols.



Water Bottles: Students will need to bring their own water bottles to school. Bottles may be filled via filling stations. Traditional water fountains will not be in service.





A Student assignments will be accessed using the Canvas and Accelerate platforms.



Students will be following a 5-day learning schedule defined by their teacher(s). Learning will allow for flexibility in pace and schedule.



Students will be expected to login each day to be counted for attendance and will be guided to follow the learning curriculum provided.

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Classroom: Students will be receiving traditional instruction following a 5-day learning schedule with our established curriculum, materials, and resources but will also be using an online blended learning platform for each of their

classes. This will allow them to become familiar with the online curriculum. Students grade 6-8 will be grouped in cohorts to the extent they are able based upon their schedules and teachers will rotate to the classrooms. Half-day on Fridays.

Lunch: Lunch will be scheduled in shifts to allow for distancing, students will be directed to eat in their designated classrooms once they obtain their food in order to reduce congregating. Students may bring their own food to school or opt for the offerings of our Food Service nutrition program.



Extracurriculars: Athletics, band, and other extracurricular activities, that allow for social distancing, will be allowed should we be able to begin the school year in phase 4 or above. Please know that all students enrolled in the MAPS district, for either in-person or online learning, will be eligible for participation in any active extracurricular opportunities.



Health Monitoring: Student temperatures and symptoms are required to be monitored from home each day to determine if they should be attending school. Should your student present with a fever 100.4 or above, they should be kept home, monitored for symptoms, and considered for testing. Your student's doctor should provide direction.

All MAPS registered students will be assigned a MAPS District teacher. This teacher will remain their teacher for the school year, whether the student remains in the online learning program or returns to school in-person.



Students will have opportunities to ask questions and receive support from teachers.



Instructions will be made available daily for following the classwork, assignments will have due dates, and grades and feedback will be provided.



Online learners are eligible to participate in extracurricular events as outlined above for "in-person."
