

 I am extremely excited to be in Manistee! I am looking forward to building relationships with my students, and am excited to be a part of such a great community. The beach is a great bonus, too!


Question 4: If you could choose any superpower what would it be?

MANISTEE COUNTRY CLUB CROWNS YOUNGEST CLUB CHAMPION






Over the weekend of August 19th, Manistee High School's own **Jacob Scharp (12)** won the Manistee Golf & Country Club Championship.



As far as he knows, he is the youngest golfer to win the yearly competition. Not only that but in between rounds, in the middle of the weekend, Jacob and his brother **Max Scharp (10)** both took a break from the links to beat Kalkaska in the Mariners' home soccer opener. The brothers' many athletic talents explain why they continually impress fans, coaches, and other players alike.

The Championship took place over three rounds of 18 holes of golf. Jacob shot a 68, 68, and 79, with two impressive rounds at 2 shots under par. Together, these rounds were enough to win by 2 strokes.

Last spring, Manistee's boys' golf team qualified for the state finals with a 2nd place regional finish. Individually, Jacob finished 4th at regionals and 10th at the state finals. This earned him all-state honors for the first time in his high school career. The team finished 7th at the state finals, a strong finish. With Scharp's continued progress and achievements, as well as the team's, they are sure to be at contenders for the state finals again this coming spring.



MARINER FOOTBALL WINS HOME OPENER





The Mariner football team opened their season at home on Thursday night with a convincing win, 45-0. Manistee took on the visiting Blue Blazers of Kalkaska.

Scoring for the Mariners were seniors **Nick Hornkohl** (2 touchdowns), **Isaiah Davis** (2 touchdowns), **Austen Halcome** (1 touchdown), and junior **Kaden Kott** (2 touchdowns). The Mariners recorded an enormous 310 rushing yards.

A big component of the game was the varsity debut of freshman quarterback **Dayvion Neal-Berry**. He threw 2 touchdowns and ran for 22 yards. It was a solid debut for the young player with high expectations.

The Mariners' defense was also on point with 6 sacks in the game. That is just one sack off from the school record of 7. The defense also allowed only 41 yards. The Mariners recorded 45 total tackles and 8.5 tackles for a loss. These statistics, along with the shutout, point towards a very strong defensive team moving forward in the season.



Kanon Petzak (12) commented that "the game was a success because Austen scored." The team agreed that their first game was a great start to the season.

The Mariners return to play on Friday, September 8, as they travel to take on Oakridge.

Manistee cross country kicked off their season at the Chippewa Hills Early Season Invite. This race was chosen because it is the same course that the Mariners will either qualify for states or finish their season on. The girls race first for the fall season this year. They were led by **Ceci Postma** (12) who placed 3rd. Behind her **Alayna Edmondson** (10) flew in to earn a medal at 30th place. 


