

#### The Marvels: A Marvel-ous Change of Pace for Marvel

Moving into my 115th consecutive Vogue movie review, I was honestly not expecting much from this film. Having seen some of Marvel's recent inadequate products on Disney+, I expected this to be around that level of quality. However, I am happy to confidently say that this was a decent turnaround for Marvel after their struggles this past half-year!

I won't act like this is a "saving grace" for Marvel, as they still have lots to prove if they wish to redeem themselves. Guardians of the Galaxy Volume 3, their last film, was still significantly better than this and does not even come close to that in terms of quality. However, compared to their other projects like Ant-Man: Quantumania and especially the first Captain Marvel, this felt like a surprisingly unique film that was a joy to watch!

For those unaware, this is a sequel to Captain Marvel that uses the gimmick of three superheroes' light powers connecting, thus allowing them to switch places with each other. Though it sounds simple in concept, its execution led to some of the best fight scenes in a Marvel movie in quite some time! The dynamics between the main characters lead to fantastic fights, but they also create great dialogue that makes the movie a joy to watch!

However, this film also has a significant flaw: its villain. We get a singular backstory scene for her, and despite her ability to quite literally end planets, she feels seriously underbaked and unintimidating. Additionally, she has no personality and feels like a placeholder that only exists because there "has to be a villain."

Despite my grievances with this movie, I did have a pretty fun time watching this film! I give *The Marvels* a rating of 6.5/10.

The Mariners swim team concluded their season with the Coastal Conference Finals on Friday and Saturday, November 3 & 4. Manistee competed against some top schools, including Traverse City West, Ludington, Gaylord, and Cadillac.

The team performed well and came away with a number of personal best times in their events. Manistee's **Laura Eix (12)** finished 4th in the 50 Free, with a time of 27.12 in the finals. Laura was just off the state qualifying time for this event. Laura finished 5th in the 100 Free with a time of 59.62, another personal best. Laura commented, saying "We had a great season! 

The challenging distance, along with the cold weather, did not deter the group of dedicated runners from completing the feat. Over 20 competitors participated, a group of Mariners hailing from several different sports, with cross-country and track being the primary sports represented.

Finishing first on the girls' side was cross-country star **Ceci Postma (12)**, who also recently concluded her XC season at the state championship with an All-State finish. She ran much of the way with Manistee alumni and current assistant coach Ashley Lindeman, who Ceci found makes "longs run easier" because she has someone to talk to.







On the boys' side, **Christian Schramski (11)** came away with the first place finish, another Mariner cross-country athlete.

Georgia Haag (10), who competed in her second EKUP on Tuesday, found that EKUP "was actually somewhat enjoyable and very rewarding," despite "all of the hills." The fact that they "had [their] cross country squad running together made it very fun." 





