



After a close loss to Shelby last season, the boys basketball team is looking to improve this year. On Monday, November 27, the Mariners kicked off their season with a home game against Onekama. Despite the score being close throughout most of the first half, the Mariners extended the lead in the second half to defeat the Portagers, 56-24. Sophomore, **Landin Sowa** played in his varsity debut Monday night, finishing with 18 points to lead the Mariner's offense. Following Sowa was Tramel Caviness (11) who scored 13 points. Sowa, Caviness, and Mason Gunnett (12) also had eight rebounds each for the Mariners.



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Following the win on Monday night, the Mariners then traveled to Mason County Central for another non-conference game on Tuesday night.

Despite trailing by 10 points early in the first half, the Mariners bounced back to defeat the Spartans 52-43. This win improved the Mariners to 2-0 record for the start of their season. Offensively, **Kaden Kott (11)** led the Mariners, scoring 17 points. **Tramel Caviness** and **Mason Gunnett** followed Kott, scoring 13 and 9 points for the Mariners.

Also, congratulations to the boy's junior varsity who also had a strong start to their season defeating both Onekama and Scottville. Foreign exchange student, **Diego Vazquez (10)** scored double figures in both games to lead the Mariners.

The Mariners will then travel to Fremont on Friday, December 1st, for their first conference game of the season.






If you are interested in playing video games, join the esports team, the spring season will be starting in February, and there is still time to join!

Door decorating will be with your advisory and will begin the week before Spirit Week. Start brainstorming with your class fun, creative, and festive ideas to cover your door with!




