Youth in Government, renowned for its student-ran conference with many leadership positions, hosted over 700 students coming from 30+ delegations. Within the Manistee Delegation, many leadership positions were filled. Braydon Sorenson (12), Alejandra Gil (10), Sadie Verheek (12), and Drew Mendians (12) all took on the role of Family Group Leader, leading groups of people in the evening through various activities. Alejandra Gil and Drew Mendians were also chosen to be Clerks, in which they carefully tracked and documented all of the amendments and changes made to bills.

What activities have you been involved in at MMHS?


 I played volleyball in tenth grade, and tennis and hope to play tennis this year. I've done powderpuff 2 times. I am currently a second year student at CTE.

I've struggled to articulate my thoughts on this film because it manages to say so little, yet it shows so much at the same time. And judging by Argylle's reviews, it's clear that most people would agree. But why, exactly, is this so? 




SPORTS CONTINUED SUPER BOWL 58 RECAP!


