The best part of being the Principal at Jefferson? Listening to all the great reading from March Reading Month! Here are some of the questions I get from Caregivers about their children's reading:

My child just wants to hear ME read, and they don't want to read to me out loud.

Ms. Raddatz says, "GREAT!" Your child's brain is doing some heavy lifting called *comprehension*. Every few pages, ask your child questions like, "What will happen next? Why did you predict that?" or "Who do you think the character will do next? Did the illustration give you a hint?" Then offer to take turns reading each page . . . and always let them choose which page first.

I let my child pick out a book that is way too hard for them.

Ms. Raddatz would like to hug you as a parent! Self-selected books are really important to a reader's growth. Children interested in dinosaurs will do the work to figure out, "brontosaurus."

My child loves/doesn't love reading books.

Whether kids like or dislike reading today doesn't mean that is how it will be forever. If you give a kid a kazoo, they will play it a lot (especially if you are in a car going to Florida.) But eventually, they slow down. The best way to sustain reading (or kazoo playing, your choice) is to *make reading a part of family time*.
