Question 3: What are you most excited about being in Manistee?


 I am most excited about being a part of the football tradition that Manistee has built over the past ten years and excited to be in the West Michigan Conference, which I have connections with.


This film follows a serial killer father attempting to escape a Taylor Swift-esque concert--which is filled to the brim with FBI agents trying to profile him-while keeping his daughter oblivious to his trueidentity. Not a single of its 105 minutes is wasted as the father struggles to escape through several approaches, and I truly had no idea where the movie would go next!

The acting is phenomenal in this movie, rivaling

the likes of American Psycho and other fantastic thrillers! While most of my enjoyment came from the wacky shenanigans the killer went through trying to escape, it's fundamentally a character-driven movie that frequently uses unexpected social interactions to create an unsettling atmosphere while thoroughly developing the killer's character.



SPORTS RECAP!

The fall sports season began August 12, and our athletes have been working to excel in their sport. For fall sports, we provide boys soccer, boys football, girls and boys cross country, girls golf, girls volleyball, girls sideline cheer, and girls swimming.

Boys soccer kicked off their season and are now **2-5** for the season. They have played Suttons Bay, Big Rapids, Ravenna, North Muskegon, Shelby, Leeland, and Hart. Key scorers for the team were Mason Robinson (12), Max Scharp (11), Juan Burnado, and Nolan Dalke (11). Freshman goalkeeper, Layne Piper (9), has also had a great season so far.

Boys varsity football has had two games. The boys won 47-12, against Kalkaska to start off the season strong. Kaden Kott (12) had a total of 157 yards and two touchdowns! Landin Sowa (11) led the team defensively with 8 tackles, yet contributed offensively by rushing nine times for a total of 58 yards and 3 touchdowns! The boy's second game was at Fremont,



where they won **22-12**. Sowa led the rushing attack with 15 carries for 113 yards, had an interception, two touchdowns, and two receptions for 31 yards. Then, Kaden Kott had 13 carries for 71 yards, two receptions for 18 yards and one touchdown. Dayvion Neal-Berry (10) led the defense with nine tackles, followed by Trevor Haag (12) with seven tackles. They are now 2-0.

Boys JV football has also had two games. They kicked their season off with a home game against Kalkaska. They fell short losing 6-20. Their touchdown was scored by **Nolan Freeman (9)**. Boys and girls cross country has had two races, their first one at Benzie. This is the annual Pete Moss Invitational. Benzie has a fast course, which both the girls and boys used to their advantage. The boys came out 10th overall. **Kaden Worch (11)** was first for the boys team, followed by **Christian Schramski (12), Eddie Huizinga (9), Brock Adamczak (9)**, then **Adam Olson (9)**. Kaden, Christian, and Eddie ended up medaling. The next race was at Scottville. The boys team ended up taking second overall. The ladies cross country also ran at the Pete Moss Invitational. The girls placed 6th overall. **Audrey Huizinga (12)** led for the ladies, and had a huge PR with the time of **21:23.9**. Second for the ladies was **Kate Somsel (12)**, then **Leia Gilland (10)**, **Alayna Edmondson (11)**, and **Lena Herberger (11)**. Medaling for them was Audrey, Kate, and Leia. Carrying their season out to Scottville, where they also placed second. Medaling for the girls was **Georgia Haag (11)**, Audrey Huizinga, Kate Somsel, Lena Herberger, Leia Gilland, and Alayna Edmondson.

Girls golf has a new head coach, **Chad Murray**. He stated, "So far, we have had 5 matches even before the school opened its doors. We currently have 7 players. **Clear Wang (11), Olivia Salmon (11), Callie Shively (10),** and **Cambell Kieffer (10)** are our returning golfers. **Gabby Senters (11), Emma Monroe (10)**, and **Bella Sorenson (10)** are new to the team and to golf. Even though we have a young team we are doing pretty well from my viewpoint. We are averaging a team score of 534 with a low score of 501. We play at Hesperia and TC West this week and next week

we travel to Fremont and Montague."

Girls varsity volleyball has had a couple games, versus Onekama, Hart and OV. Against Onekama, they lost the first set 7-25, the second set 10-25, and the third set 10-25. Against Hart, they won the first set 25-19, lost the second set 21-25, the third set 16-25, and the fourth set 15-25. For OV, they won the first set 25-23, the second set 25-14, lost the third set 9-25, and won the fourth set 25-14.



During this game, **Lindsey Gardner (11)** carried the team in kills with 16! **Maya** Goodspeed (9) led the team in blocks with 3! Lastly, **Paelynne Kolk (10)** had 13 digs for the team! Their fourth game was against Suttons Bay, which they ended up winning. T**hey won all the sets with scores of: 26-24, 25-14, and 15-7.**

Girls JV volleyball also played Onekama, Hart, OV, and Suttons Bay. They won their first game to Onekama, lost their second game to Hart, won their third game to OV, and won against Suttons Bay.

Lastly, the girls' swim has had one meet. They finished the meet with 28 points, and only 4 girls competed. **Evelyn Koller (11)** said, "We have a small team, yet still very mighty. We are working hard, doing the best we can, and having fun. It's a struggle with the small team, but in the end, it'll make us better. I love the coaches, and they keep us very motivated. I feel like it'll be a very good year."
