



## **FALL FUN!**


Fall in Manistee, Michigan, is marked by crisp air, early frosts, and the vibrant transition of leaves to deep reds, oranges, and yellows. Located along the shores of Lake Michigan, the area experiences cooler temperatures earlier in the season due to its northern location and proximity to the lake, which moderates the climate but also brings occasional lake-effect winds and precipitation.





In early fall, daytime temperatures in Manistee typically range from the mid-50s to low 60s°F (10-15°C), while nights can dip into the 30s°F (around 0-5°C). By late October and into November, the weather becomes more unpredictable, with cold fronts bringing gusty winds and sometimes the first light snow of the season.

The cold weather encourages outdoor activities like hiking through the Manistee National Forest or taking scenic drives along M-22 to see the beautiful fall colors. However, as temperatures continue to drop, residents begin preparing for winter by winterizing homes, stacking firewood, and ensuring their cars are equipped for icy conditions.
