While many students spend their weekends at home or out with friends, a small group of Manistee High racers spend theirs at the drag strip. For them, drag racing isn't a pastime but a competitive sport that demands focus, preparation, and precision.

Drag racing involves two cars launching side by side down a straight quarter-mile track, aiming to cross the finish line first. Races are held at sanctioned drag strips under strict safety regulations, making the sport structured and accessible to young drivers.

Several Manistee students have taken part in these events. **Cheyenne Martin (11),** competes in these events and had this to say about the feeling of lining up before a race; "It's all about reaction time. Either you get it or you don't."

Many racers work on their cars themselves, spending hours tuning engines, adjusting parts, and learning the technical side of performance driving. **Ean Guenhardt (11)** said this about how often he tweaks his car: "It mostly just depends on what happens at the track. Say I blow up some things then there will be more maintenance to do but it's mostly measuring and changing fluids in the car."




STAFF OF THE WEEK: COACH DREW SHEFFIELD





Congratulations, **Jordyn** on being this week's star student! Your hard work, kindness, and positivity shine through and set good examples for everyone around you!


