

- How was the emotions with that also being your last football game in high school?
- It made the record more meaningful, like my hard work for the sport paid off. Made me realize how much more effort I put into the game compared to what I thought.



#### **Interview Continued:**

From Mr. Hendges:

- Background of Mr. Hendges Experience with the record -
- To be honest, I didn't even know I was a record holder until just a few years ago. Behind the scenes Coach Rischel spent countless hours at the library here in town going over old newspaper articles, researching, and he compiled all the school football records you see now. It's hard to recollect but I think we (my quarterback Aaron Anderson and I) may have completed a touchdown in our last game of the 1994 season, against Benzie so it makes sense that that's when we tied the season record of 7 receiving touchdowns held by Mike Gustad going back to 1984.
- Who was your biggest influence in your football career, coaching and playing?
- Dave Russell. My head coach. A second father to me, even today. Not a chance I'm who I am today without having had him in my life as a coach. And I had other fantastic coaches too. Steve Ward. That guy was no-nonsense. Both of them and others simply drilled into me and my buddies that football is all about the team. If you didn't understand that, you weren't welcome.
- What was your initial thought on Braylen breaking your record?
- He and I had been talking about it for over a month. He wanted it bad, I could see it in his eyes, but he wouldn't say it out loud. Dayvion wanted it bad too. And I wanted it really really bad for them. I had goosebumps when it happened. B is loaded with character and integrity. So is Dayvion. They both have been raised right. To have the record broken by a young man like B, and how he carries himself, is truly one of the best things I've been able to be a part of in my time in the Stee. And maybe what's best thing of all is B wanted this even more for his team. For his buddies, family, school. He's unselfish. Via his actions he sends a strong message to younger kids: "if you are gonna play this game, play it for your teammates, not yourself." It's not just that he set the record, it's how he did it. Good old fashioned hard work.

### **Interview Continued:**

#### From Mr. Hendges:

- What were your greatest strengths and weaknesses with football?
- If I had to choose one I'd say my biggest strength was that I only cared about how we performed as a team. Nothing else mattered. B is the same way. In any sport he plays, he is the same way. His boys know he's in it for them. In fact as I answer this question, I am kinda dreaming (it's what old athletes do...) about being on the field with a kid like B. A kid like that, I mean how he plays, makes playing fun for everyone. It's infectious. He forces you, through his actions, to up your game. To be better. That's legit leadership. Weaknesses for me as a player... I don't know, probably too emotional. Ha.
- How have your high school years of football impacted you now coaching?
- Impacted me immensely. I was so blessed to have wonderful coaches. Some I already mentioned. In hoops I had guys like Terry Walker, Jerry Brown. Just exceptional coaches and men. I regretfully didn't play baseball but even talking when I was young with coach George Edmondson helped lead me in the right direction and honestly I just ride the coattails of those guys all these years later.
- Did you expect this record to be broken, how long after it was broken?
- I mean all records are broken at some point, and that just means there are more and more kids out there that strive to work hard enough to break said records, and I think that's awesome. So, yes. But I'm hoping Braylen's record stands for quite a while. It would be nice for him to enjoy it for years to come and maybe even have it down the road to share with his kids.
- Do you remember who held it before you and when they achieved that?
- Mike Gustad is who I tied for the record. 1984. It's my understanding that he is a teacher down in the Detroit area and coached football for a long time too. Sounds to be a high quality guy, which why wouldn't he be, he's a Gustad. I don't want to speak for him, but I am quite confident that he would be, and may already be, very proud of Braylen. We all are.
