AP Courses



- Year long course
- Pay for test (\$99.00 per test, *subject to change each year*)
- Typically a 3, 4, or 5 will earn your college credit
- The college or university determines how to interpret the test score ([CLICK HERE TO CHECK](#))
- Grades are on a 5.0 scale instead of a 4.0 scale

How do I get in?

- Request the class during the course registration process
(You will need a teacher recommendation)

Summit Tech CTE Courses



- Year long course
- 3 class periods of your day
- Must maintain a B average or better to earn college credit
- College credit is awarded by WSCC
- Different programs earn different amounts of college credit
- Must maintain a C average or better to waive 1 science credit or 1 world language credit

How do I get in?

- Request the program you want during the course registration process
- Make sure you are on track to graduate and that you have good attendance

** Seniors get priority when determining student placement*

ASM Tech Early Middle College



- Application process
- Senior year attend ASM Tech (at WSCC)
- One extra year of high school (earn diploma and associate's degree at the same time)
- Earn an Associate's degree (usually) through WSCC

How do I get in?

- Pick up the red folder from Mrs. Hammer
- Complete application by March 1, 2026

Dual Enrollment



- Take a WSCC course during the school day
- MMHS covers the cost unless you fail the course
- MMHS reimburses you for the textbook at the end of the course unless you fail the course
- Follow the WSCC academic calendar
- Use WSCC email and canvas for communication
- Course registration is first come, first serve
- Take up to 10 courses during high school (typically students don't start until 11th grade)
- Passing the class earns you the college credit
