Work Study (Grade 12)



- Semester or year long course
- 1-3 hours of a school day
- Paid or unpaid internship
- Student finds placement and self-transport
- Must align with the student Educational Development Plan (EDP) recorded in Xello, MAPS career exploration platform

Steps to Participate

- Request the class during the course registration process
- Additional paperwork required before a student can start their placement

In-Person AP Courses (Grades 10-12)



- Year long course
- Pay for test (\$99.00 per test, *subject to change each year*)
- Typically a 3, 4, or 5 will earn college credit
- The college or university determines how to interpret the test score ([CLICK HERE TO CHECK](#))
- Grades are on a 5.0 scale instead of a 4.0 scale

 - You will need a teacher recommendation

Summit Tech CTE Courses (Grades 11-12)



- Year long course
- 3 hours of a school day
- Must maintain a B average or better to earn college credit through WSCC (different programs earn different amounts of college credit)
- Must maintain a C average or better to waive 1 science credit or 1 world language credit
- Must align with the student Educational Development Plan (EDP) recorded in Xello MAPS career exploration platform

Steps to Participate

- Request the program you want during the course registration process

** Seniors get priority when determining student placement*

Dual Enrollment (Grades 8-12)



- Take a WSCC course during the school day
- MMHS covers the cost unless the course is not successfully completed.
- MMHS reimburses the cost of the textbook at the end of the course unless the course requirements are not met
- Follow the WSCC academic calendar
- Use WSCC email and canvas for communication
- Course registration is first come, first serve
- Take up to 10 courses during high school (typically students don't start until grade 11)
- Passing the class earns college credit
